Landmark Judgements That Changed India

[Rupa Publications India](#) The executive, the legislature and the judiciary are the three branches of government, both state and central, in India. Of these, it is the judiciary's task to uphold constitutional values and ensure justice for all. The interpretation and application of constitutional values by the judicial system has had far-reaching impact, often even altering provisions of the Constitution itself. Although our legal system was originally based on the broad principles of the English common law, over the years it has been adapted to Indian traditions and been changed, for the better, by certain landmark verdicts. In *Landmark Judgments that Changed India*, former Supreme Court judge and eminent jurist Asok Kumar Ganguly analyses certain cases that led to the formation of new laws and changes to the legal system. Union of India and Others* that defined personal liberty; and *Golaknath v. State of Punjab*, where it was ruled that amendments which infringe upon fundamental rights cannot be passed.
